Devotional Thoughts

I want to tell you about Tony. Tony came to church with his wife every Sunday. She was a member. He wasn't. She urged him to take classes and join, but he knew doing so would be insincere. He did not believe all the things the pastor said about Jesus. How could one man dying on a cross two thousand years ago benefit us? It seemed more than a little far-fetched. But he came and sat next to her at church every Sunday for six years. He liked the music, enjoyed how the pastor's sermon explained in detail what the Bible account was about, and it also helped that it kept his wife from bugging him about becoming a member.

Then, one Monday morning, Tony walked into the pastor's office unannounced. "I'm ready to take one of those membership classes and start believing in Jesus," he said. The pastor smiled and agreed to start meeting once a week for classes. By the time the classes were over and Tony was ready to start believing in Jesus, the pastor said with that same smile, "Tony, I don't know when you came to faith, but it wasn't today. And it wasn't when you came into my office two months ago to schedule classes. For six years, now, you've been sitting in the pews and hearing God's word. And whether you recognize it or not, the Holy Spirit has been at work in your heart and convincing you that Jesus is exactly who he claims to be: your Savior." Tony became a member the next Sunday, but his faith had begun long ago.

Faith is a fickle thing. We can't see it. We can't measure it. But God knows it. And he knows it because he's the one who created that faith. He created it through his word, whether it was a person wandering into church because they were hurting and hearing the pastor's sermon or a friend at the bar sharing a drink and the hope in Christ that she has even when it feels like life is going awry. Our goals in producing workers for a growing harvest

Jesus declared the fields ripe for harvest yet lamented the scarcity of workers—a truth that remains prevalent today as we sustain and expand ministry efforts. Planting new churches, opening mission fields, and growing Lutheran schools amplify the call for pastors, teachers, and staff ministers to serve as Christ's ambassadors. We pray that God will guide us to be faithful stewards of his mission as we intensify recruitment and training efforts while also aligning plans for ministry growth with our current realities.

Expand pathways into gospel ministry

God calls his people to serve his kingdom in diverse ways. While we face a shortage of called workers and candidates for ministry, there are also new opportunities to ensure every willing heart can serve no matter their earthly circumstances. We will continue expanding pathways into gospel ministry so that every person who desires to serve in ministry has opportunities to do so.

Innovate recruitment efforts for future called workers

Though the percentage of WELS youth training for ministry holds steady, decades of membership decline yield fewer souls to answer Christ's calling. We must pursue bold, creative recruitment to reach the next generations of called workers. Through this plan, we pray the Holy Spirit works through our recruitment efforts to spark passion for gospel ministry in young adult and second-career candidates.

Ensure the long-term stability of ministerial education

Our ministerial education schools are essential to carrying out Christ's mission. Each school must remain steadfast, adaptable, and financially sound to equip future called workers for ministry. We will establish the long-term stability of our ministerial education schools through thoughtful strategy, praying God will bless the training of his workers.

Establish a sustainable strategy for called worker development

We are called to share Christ's love while also being faithful stewards of our resources. Our goal is to help WELS leaders—in the synod, congregations, and schools—consider their options for sustainable staffing and ministry opportunities. Trusting the Holy Spirit to bless these efforts, we will ensure the growing number of ministry opportunities matches the workforce God has called to serve.

Support the well-being of called workers

The Lord sends workers to a harvest that demands steadfast endurance. It is our duty as a synod and as congregations to support our workers' service. We will bolster the well-being of called workers by equipping them with resources for spiritual renewal, emotional fortitude, and physical vigor while empowering congregations with practical tools to meet their workers' needs.

font, as plain water is poured over the his or her head and the promises of God are spoken to that child. Again, you can't see it or measure it. Some would even claim faith can't be there. But God knows it's there because he created it.

This brings me great comfort when I think about the people in my life whose faith I'm unsure about. I think especially about my dad's cousin. His father and my grandpa were really close brothers who made sure the family stayed connected, so two or three times a year, even as everyone was spread throughout the Midwest, we'd meet in Tomahawk, WI to fix up the hunting cabin, fish on Great Grandma's lake, and every November freeze our tails off in our hand-made stands for deer season. Even after my grandpa and great uncle passed, as we've gotten together less at the cabin, my dad's cousin still gets the invite to family weddings and shows up for family funerals. He's never been a church-going man, but these events give him opportunities to hear the promises of the one who paid for his sins at the cross. Does he have faith? I don't know, but God does, and as we hear is scripture, the word never returns empty (Isaiah 55:11).

I've hear the best stories from our members. A husband who started attending church the week before his passing. A father who finally welcomed the preaching of the gospel on his deathbed. I'm comforted to know that there will be many faces in heaven we do not expect to be there right now. And there are people in your life who may be apathetic to the gospel or completely against it right now, but will one day stand beside you and confess Jesus as Lord. When and who? Well, only God knows.

So, don't try to test for faith, friends. When you share God's promises with others, the accomplishment is not in winning them to express what faith they have to you. The accomplishment is sharing the good news. God will work. He promises to work, in his time and for his purposes. And if, in six years, your Tony walks into the pastor's office for classes, we will rejoice. But we won't be surprised that the Holy Spirit did what the Holy Spirit promises to do. Amen.
